New Choir Robes Dedicated in Memory of Bobbie Lane

The new choir robes were dedicated during the service on March 13. Choir director Anna Bush said a few words and dedicated the new choir robes in loving memory of Bobbie Lane. She explained that although the new robes look just like the old ones, they had decided to go back to the black color since it goes with everything. The fabric of the new robes is much lighter and breathable, cooler to wear, and therefore more comfortable for our choir members. Her best guess is the previous robes were purchased in the 1970s or earlier!

"The new robes were funded by memorial funds the church received after Bobbie's passing, and in part by her family," said Anna during the dedication. "I think she would be thrilled to know that part of her legacy is that we were able to get these new robes, and we will always think of her when we wear them. We are so grateful and thankful for the generosity of all."

Anna went on to share several sweet memories and stories about Bobbi. "I want you to know that Bobbie wasn't just a dedicated choir member who we loved and who made us laugh, but she was also involved in this church in many other ways. She was part of the folding bulletins parties that would take place here on Fridays, and in the last years and even last months of her life, she helped Loida on Wednesday nights with the children's fellowship groups. I would come in to get ready for choir and she would be serving their snacks or wiping tables cleaning up after them. She was truly a servant at this church in many different ways, and I want to challenge us all here today to remember her example and BE LIKE BOBBIE. Find a need in this church, a place where your talents can be used and show up. I feel like we are in a new season post global pandemic and post building renovation, and now it feels like a season where we are renovating this church on the inside. Let's all come together and BE LIKE BOBBIE and truly be servants and find ways that. God can be glorified in what we do."

"And lastly, I want to say thank you so much for all the ways you encourage our music ministry. Many of you come up after service and tell us how great we sounded or played. Some of you have given extra offerings to cover special musicians like we had a Christmas. You have been so kind and generous, and your encouragement means so much to us! We want you all to know that our prayer is that God is glorified through our music, and we are thankful for each opportunity to be here and share that with you."





Catching Up with the Beacons: Missions and Community

Our Beacons youth group were so busy spreading joy and kindness over the holiday season of 2021. We began by assisting with the Salvation Army Thanksgiving meals. Nicole Harrison, Eve Trotter, Margaret McGuire, and Joy Barlow once again headed up this project for our church. The Beacons picked up the food for the 50 Thanksgiving meal kits at Food Lion on the Wednesday morning before Thanksgiving. Back at the church, we unloaded and sorted the food into boxed meal kits with the help of some of our congregational members, older Faith Friends and the Girl Scout troops that use our Scout Hut for their meetings. Several Beacons stayed on throughout the day and assisted Eve and Nicole with the delivery of the boxed Thanksgiving meals to those families who pick up at the church.

The Beacons also collected and bought canned hams and cornbread mix for food kits being put together by volunteers including some of our youth for the Helping Hands Foundation. These non-perishable holiday food kits fed approximately 150 low-income families in our local community.

Over Christmas, the Beacons collected items such as slippers, personal hygiene products, pajamas, and lap blankets that we dropped off at several of the nursing homes/continuing care facilities in Mount Airy. We also bought and stuffed Christmas goodies to fill four shoeboxes to send off for Operation Christmas Child.

In March, the Beacons assisted Helping Hands by priming three bedrooms in the old Shepherd's House building which will become the new location for this organization. They were excited to have Mike Branch join them and give them some pointers. They hope to be able to work with other adults in our church on future community projects.

In April, we are getting ready to send 15 kits that include shampoos, conditioners, body wash, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and other personal hygiene products to donate to Surry Medical Ministries for a special project to help migrant farmers and their families in Surry and Yadkin County.

The Beacons have also begun collecting specific item(s) for the Shepherd's House residents each month. For April, the item is laundry detergent. There is a basket in the foyer for this collection effort.





Sabbatical Update: May 31-August 29

Griff will be taking his sabbatical May 31 through August 29. Our Presbytery recommends that pastors take a sabbatical every seven years. This month marks Griff's seventh year with us.
